Banding of Haemorrhoids



PATIENT INFORMATION

What are haemorrhoids?

Haemorrhoids are excess tissue in the anal canal (Lower bowel) composed of swollen veins and anal canal lining. The normal anal canal has veins underneath its lining but when these become swollen and / or move outside the anal canal they can cause symptoms of pain, bleeding and itching.

What is banding?

Banding is an outpatient treatment for haemorrhoids. It involves a very tight elastic band being placed around the base of your haemorrhoids (excess tissue) to cut off their blood supply. This results in a shrivelling up of the excess tissue which then dies and passes out of your bowel. It is unlikely that you will see this happen. The bowel lining then heals over a period of 2 - 3 weeks.

Pain relief

After banding you will have some discomfort. This can last for up to 2 weeks but this does vary between different people. In the first couple of days you should take Paracetamol as instructed on the tablet box or as required.

If you have severe anal or rectal discomfort please contact your GP or After-hours medical centre.

Bleeding

It is common to have some bleeding as the haemorrhoid separates from your body. This is no cause for concern and should gradually dry up over a few days.

If you have a lot of bleeding at any time after you have had banding you should urgently contact your GP or After-hours medical centre.

How long will I need to have off work?

Banding is an outpatient procedure and you should be able to return to work the same day. It is common to feel as though you want to have a bowel motion after banding. Try to not have a bowel motion

for a couple of hours after banding as this could cause the bands to come off.
