Paediatric squint surgery – postoperative care and advice

What to expect after the operation

Any eye patch should be removed the morning after the operation. Please do not replace it as is important that your child's eyes need to start working together as soon as possible. Your child will be prescribed a short course of eye drops. This is to help prevent infection. Your child's eyelids should be cleaned before giving your child the eye drops (see the instruction sheet for how to do this). You can expect some swelling around your child's eyelids. Your child's eye will be red. This redness will slowly improve over the next 2-3 weeks.

Avoid touching your child's eye, and encourage your child not to touch, poke, rub or scratch their eye.

Will my child need pain relief?

Your child may experience mild pain. You can give your child Paracetamol to help with any pain they have. Make sure that you follow the instructions on the medicine bottle.

After a general anaesthetic

The effects of the anaesthetic can last for 24-48 hours. We recommend that your child rests and takes things easy during this time. Normal activities may be resumed within 2-3 days. Your child may have a slight cough from where the breathing tube irritated their throat during their anaesthetic.

Contact a Doctor for help if your child has any of the following:

- Your child is having regular pain relief and they are still in pain
- Drowsiness
- Vomiting
- Poor feeding
- Decreased vision

Please tell the doctor your child has just had squint surgery.
