Vitrectomy and retinal detachment – postoperative care and advice

Patient Information

What to expect after the operation

If you have an eye patch, this should be removed the morning after your operation. Please do not replace it.

Your eyelids should be cleaned before you put in any eye drops. The general eye care instruction sheet you have been given will help you with this task.

Avoid touching your eye. You can expect your eye to be red, and to have some swelling around your eyelids. Do not poke, rub or scratch your eye.

If you have had gas, air or oil put into your eye during surgery, you are strongly advised to follow the instructions regarding the positioning of your head and sleeping position.

Positioning instructions;

If you have had air or gas put into your eye you are strongly advised not to:

- Travel in an airplane
- Travel to altitude e.g. driving over the Rimutaka hills
- Or have some types of anaesthetic
- Do not remove your green wrist band until you are advised to do so by your doctor

Your surgeon will tell you when it is safe to take off your wrist band.

Pain relief

You may have some mild pain. You can take Paracetamol to help with the pain. A maximum of 2 tablets (1 gram) 4 hourly.

No more than 8 tablets (4 grams) in a 24 hour (1day) period.

After a general anaesthetic

You may feel drowsy because a small amount of the anaesthetic may still remain in your body. This can slow your reaction time/ coordination and affect your judgement /reasoning for the next 24 hours after your operation.

We recommend that you rest during this time. Adults: During the first 24hours after your operation it is important that you do not drive a car, cycle, ride a motor cycle or, operate machinery, drink alcohol or sign any legal papers.

You may have a slight cough or a sore /dry throat.

You can start your normal daily activities again after 2-3 days.

Contact a Doctor for help if you have any of the following:

- You have an aching eye
- You are taking regular pain relief and are still in pain
- You have decreasing vision (your vision may be expected to be poor after your surgery but it should not get worse)
- You have any nausea or vomiting
