

A Guide to HSC's 2006/07 Gaming and Betting Activities Survey Data Tables

These data have been released to allow New Zealanders to access and use the information they contain.

The GBAS methodology on pages 367 of the [2006/07 Gaming and Betting Activities Survey 2006/07: New Zealanders' knowledge, views and experiences of gambling and gambling-related harm](#) report should be read prior to interpreting these data. The [questionnaire](#) and [showcards](#) are available for further context.

The data have been closely checked to ensure that individual survey respondents cannot be identified from these tables. To ensure respondents' confidentiality and reduce reporting of imprecise estimates, figures have been removed from the table if they were estimated from fewer than 30 respondents.

The data presented are cross-sectional ie, they represent one point in time.

Comparing these data with other sources of data is not recommended, the questions, samples and method of analysis would all need to be comparable. Note that the weighting methodology used in these tables differs slightly from the weighting used for the 2010 Health and Lifestyles Survey. For comparable figures from the two surveys we recommend you read research publications that present analyses of both of these surveys together (eg, [New Zealanders' Participation in Gambling](#)).

The number of people represented in this banner /by-variable group who are in this category of the indicator. Eg. of the 206 Māori who are represented in the sample, 65 of them played pokies at a pub or a club in the past 12 months.

When the unweighted and weighted base sizes of the Total column are 1973 then the figures in the table are representative of the New Zealand population aged 15+ years. If they are less than this then they represent a subset of the population.
